BILL NO.	TITLE OF BILL	ACTION
SENATE 1	Right to Carry for Dog Wardens (Agriculture and Rural Affairs) An act to allow dog wardens the use of stun guns and firearms in the performance of his or her duties.	
SENATE 2	PA Fruit and Vegetable Producers Assistance Act (Agriculture and Rural Affairs) An act to allow a disaster recovery grant program to assist fruit and vegetable farmers who experience losses exceeding 25% of expected production of eligible Pennsylvania grown crops due to spring weather events.	
SENATE 3	Data Center Regulation Act (Communications and Technology) An act providing for the regulations of commercial data centers.	
SENATE 4	Parental Consent to Join Online Social Media Networks (Communications and Technology) An Act that requires parental consent to join online Social Media networks.	
SENATE 5	Educational Choice for Families (Education) An Act amending the public-school code to allow families to choose the school that best suits their child's education needs.	
SENATE 6	Abolishing Standardized Testing Requirements (Education) An act providing that all Pennsylvania elementary and secondary public schools will no longer be required to complete standardized testing requirements.	
SENATE 7	Legalization of Marijuana (Law and Justice) An Act stating the sale of marijuana is legal to those over 18 years old with regulations.	
SENATE 8	Lowering the Age from 18 to 16 Years Old to Handle, Serve and Dispense Alcohol in a Restaurant (Law and Justice) An Act amending the Pennsylvania liquor code.	
SENATE 9	Allowing High School Students to Vote in Local School Board Elections (State Government) An Act amending the Pennsylvania Election Code to allow a high school student to vote in local school board elections.	
SENATE 10	Changing the Required Voting Age to 16 Years Old (State Government) An Act stating that every citizen over 16 years of age, is entitled to vote in all elections.	
SENATE 11	Statewide Red Light Camera Act (Transportation)	

An Act amending the Pennsylvania Vehicles Code to authorize the use of red light cameras for traffic violations by any municipality in the Commonwealth.	
SENATE 12 Lowering Pennsylvania’s Driving Age to 15 (Transportation) An act amending the Pennsylvania Driving Code to allow 15-year-olds to apply for a learner’s permit.
