<b>BILL NO.</b>	<b>TITLE of BILL</b>	<b>ACTION</b>
<b>SENATE 1</b>	Prohibiting Consumer Fireworks in Pennsylvania (Agriculture & Rural Affairs)  An act prohibiting aerial fireworks in this Commonwealth and imposing penalties.	
<b>SENATE 2</b>	Allowing Sunday Hunting (Agriculture & Rural Affairs)  An act providing that all Pennsylvanians who hold a valid hunting license be allowed to hunt on all Sundays during a calendar year.	
<b>SENATE 3</b>	Defining Privacy Rights on Social Media and Penalizing the Offense of Cyber Bullying (Communications & Technology)  An act requiring all social media platforms to explicitly state user privacy rights, and increase penalties for cyber bullying individuals through social media.	
<b>SENATE 4</b>	Parental Consent to Join Online Social Networks (Communications & Technology)  This bill prohibits those under the age of eighteen (18) years of age from joining Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, or any other online social network without parental consent.	
<b>SENATE 5</b>	High School Sports Program Eliminated (Education)  As a cost-saving measure to school district budgets, all high school sports programs will be eliminated. Club sports, independent of schools, will take the place of school related sports programs.	
<b>SENATE 6</b>	K-12 School Day Start Times (Education)  An act providing that all Pennsylvania elementary and secondary public schools may not begin class before 9:00 AM.	
<b>SENATE 7</b>	Victoria's Law (Judiciary)  An act banning the sale of dogs, cats and rabbits in retail stores in Pennsylvania.	
<b>SENATE 8</b>	Elected Official and Social Media (Judiciary)  An act prohibiting the removal of any elected official from a social media platform.	
<b>SENATE 9</b>	Voter Identification (State Government)  All individuals that present themselves to vote at a Pennsylvania polling place must provide valid identification in order to cast a ballot. Identification must be provided at every election.	
<b>SENATE 10</b>	Daylight Saving Time (State Government)  The Commonwealth shall enter into permanent Daylight Saving Time, effective March 12, 2023.	
<b>SENATE 11</b>	Cell Phone Use While Operating a Motor Vehicle (Transportation)  The use of a hand-held cellular phone while operating a motor vehicle that is in motion upon a public roadway is prohibited. Any person who violates this law shall be guilty of a summary offense with a maximum fine of \$100.	
<b>SENATE 12</b>	Mandatory One-Year Teen Driver Learner's Permit (Transportation)  An act providing a one-year driver learner's permit requirement for all teen drivers.
